

Letting the Shepherd Lead...

For the past few days, we have experienced 90-degree weather, which with our South Carolina humidity, makes it feel more like 100-degree weather. With such heat, there is no better way to refresh ourselves than by sitting a few minutes under a shady tree, by sipping an ice-cold glass of water, or by the resting in the blessing of a summer breeze. When the summer heat presses in, it is easy to feel parched, dry, and overwhelmed.

In the Bible, Jeremiah uses this picture of dry, parched heat to describe the heart of a person who puts his trust in men and the strength from flesh (17:5-6). In that same passage, Jeremiah also tells us that when the heat comes, those who trust in the Lord need not worry because they have roots connected to the source of living water and they will never fail to bear fruit (17:7-8). The difference between someone who is overwhelmed and burdened and someone who is thankful, grateful, and blessed is not the absence of heat in the blessed person's life. We all will face challenges and stresses. No, the difference is that when the heat comes, the blessed person knows where to turn to find relief! Friends, do we turn to Jesus when the heat increases in our lives? I want to encourage us all to take some time this summer to turn to Christ.

- On June 6 we will begin a new message series entitled Spiritual Battlegrounds: Eight Practical Ways to Overcome. We will take a verse-by-verse look through Ephesians 6:10-19, which we know as the "Armor of God" passage. For each of the next eight weeks, we will examine a spiritual struggle and ways to be refreshed by trusting in God's armor. These struggles are unbelief, idolatry, demonic influences, hopelessness, doubt, guilt, spiritual guidance, and spiritual calling. Do you know someone who needs to overcome a struggle through the refreshing encouragement of Christ? Invite that person to worship with us at Morningside during this series.
- Throughout the month of June, our Staff will lead the devotions for our Virtual Prayer Meeting, airing on Wednesday nights on our website. That opportunity can provide mid-week refreshment from God's Word.
- We all need some personal refreshment time with God. On July 1, we will start our church-wide summer devotion. Pick up your free copy of O.S. Hawkins' *The Apostles' Code*, the follow-up to the *Easter Code*, at entrances to the Sanctuary, in the Fellowship Hall Lobby, or in the Church Office during regular office hours. Tune into our Virtual Prayer Meeting on July 7 for our first devotional.

Remember the only difference between those who are spiritually parched and those who are spiritually refreshed is knowing where to turn for refreshment. I pray that you will find refreshment in Jesus through the opportunities offered this summer.



Regional's Healthcare System has updated its policy regarding visitation to non-Covid patients under these conditions:

- Pastors may visit church members as one of the two visitors during the hours of 10:00 A.M. -1:00 P.M. and 6:00 - 9:00 P.M.
- Pastors and the patient or family member must coordinate visits with the attending nurse.
- A visit by a pastor would preclude one family member from seeing the loved one that day.
- Pastors must wear a mask during the visit and as they travel throughout the hospital.
