
## Worship Enhancement Initiative Offering Sunday, November 1

## Letting the Shepherd Lead...

Recently I came across a booklet by Jonathan Leeman and Andy Naselli. The title caught my attention: "How Can I Love Church Members with Different Politics?" As members of the same body of Christ, we must learn how to continue to love one another no matter how the upcoming presidential election concludes. It is very easy to say with Romans 15:5-7, "May the God of endurance and encouragement grant you to live in such harmony with one another, in accord with Christ Jesus, that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore welcome one another as Christ Jesus has welcomed you, for the glory of God." Practically, however, welcoming someone who voted against the person, party, and platform we supported is difficult.

Let's be honest. We have all been tempted to say, "How can they be a Christian and support that?" As believers, we all want to do what is right and oppose what is wrong. This godly desire, when not carefully monitored, can raise the temperature and pressure on relationships where believers disagree on matters of Christian liberty. In an election year, those conflicts have only been elevated. Depending on our choice of candidate, November 4<sup>th</sup> could seem like a joyous affirmation of liberty or a tyrannical disaster waiting to happen.

So how do we disagree with someone in a way that allows us to welcome them as a fellow believer?

- ♦ First, we must recognize two types of issues that demand distinct responses. "Straight-line issues" are those that Scriptures call for a certain application. Such an issue is one where we would say the Bible is so clear that a person cannot be a Christian or a church member without believing. Most of these issues, which are theological in nature, may refer to beliefs like trusting in Jesus' sacrificial death for sinners. But consider our belief that murder is wrong. Would we welcome into our church a person who believes that murder is morally neutral? Would we consider them a Christian? On straight-line issues, we bind consciences to what the Scripture clearly teaches.
- ◆ Secondly, "jagged-line issues" are those where godly, Bible-believing Christians may understand the Scriptural teaching but apply it in differing ways. These issues of Christian liberty do not demand that we bind someone's conscience, but rather welcome and love those with whom we might disagree. On "jagged-line issues," we do not claim a person who disagrees with us cannot be a believer or a church member. For instance, Philippians 2:3-4 teaches us to consider others as more important than ourselves. Some may take this passage as a call to provide universal healthcare. Some may see it as a call to reduce regulation so others can make their own healthcare choices. Both viewpoints may be valid applications and should be welcomed in God's family.
- Thirdly then, we should emphasize and promote the factor that truly unites us, namely Jesus Christ. Regardless of the differences we may have, we do not want to jeopardize our relationship with Christ or with one another. We try to humbly seek understanding by gently discussing why we vote and believe as we do. Even so, whenever we discuss areas of Christian liberty, it may lower the temperature and pressure if we begin by saying that folks are free to disagree with how we believe on this issue. Being able to do so is a sign of Christian maturity and a clear indication that the unity we have in Jesus Christ is more important to us than uniformity on political issues.

My prayer is that we will truly seek to live in harmony and welcome one another as Jesus Christ welcomed us!
