Letting the Shepherd Lead...

After having COVID-19, tiredness and a cough linger on, affecting my ability to mount a sustained effort to do anything. At times I feel like the disciples who were with Jesus the night he was betrayed. As he found them sleeping—when they should have been praying—he said described their condition: "the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak" (Matthew 26:41, Mark 14:38). As I wake up—either in the morning or from a nap—I have to prioritize the tasks that need to be accomplished, knowing that I will "run out of steam" at some point during the day.

This whole experience brought to mind my father-in-law's favorite psalm. I think that Scripture means so much to him because of his lifetime of Scouting, both as a boy and a leader. I also know, however, that the perspective of knowing a God who will keep our lives and eternities pervades my father-in-law's life. Psalm 121:1 asks, "I lift my eyes to the hills, from where does my help come?" The psalmist immediately answers his own question: "My help comes from the Lord who made heaven and earth." No matter what challenges we face, we can find no greater helper than the One who creates everything.

The next two verses mean so much to me at a time when my weakness is so apparent. Verses 2-3 states, "He will not let your foot be moved, he who keeps you will not slumber. Behold he who keeps Israel will neither slumber nor sleep." When I am weak, when my energy wains, and when my efforts are not sufficient, I receive great comfort in knowing that my Lord will not rest from sustaining and helping me. This knowledge does not give me permission to fail in my devotion to Him; rather it helps me recognize that my Lord will honor and amplify the feeble effort I offer!

Friends, in times like these, discouragement and fear about our frailties and weaknesses stand out. When we are well and are no longer concerned about a global pandemic, it may become very easy to begin trusting in our own works and efforts more than in the Savior and His saving and sustaining grace. My prayer is that we will grow in our trust in a Lord who is eternally faithful to help us and keep us safe.



Covid - 19 Recommended Guidelines

The Deacons and Staff ask you to observe the following:

- Practice all social distancing guidelines. Some class locations have been changed to accommodate this guideline.
- Place your offering in the baskets located at the entrances to and exits from the Sanctuary.
- Follow instructions provided by the Staff on exiting the Sanctuary after Sunday worship services.

We will continue worship services and Bible Study as long as we receive no restrictions from the government. Each Sunday School class can determine whether it will continue. Classes may decide whether they will meet at church or at another location.

If a person who attended services on Sunday tests positive for Covid-19, the church family will be alerted.

During the Corona-virus pandemic, our Staff has not been making in-person visits to the hospital or homes unless requested by the patient or family. We continue calling to check on the condition of individuals who are ill. Please be aware

of the Regional's Healthcare System's policy: "Patients at Spartanburg Regional's hospitals will be allowed one visitor per patient." *Any* visitor would preclude a family member from seeing their loved one that day.
